## Overall Guidelines

- Dimensions are given as width $x$ height unless otherwise noted
- Default image size is 2100 width $\times 1400$ height pixels at 72 ppi (pixels per inch) resolution
- For image sizes, see http://rutgers-pattern-lab.herokuapp.com
- Export photos and save for web as optimized jpg files
- Save graphics or artwork as png files
- Note that the RCCL system automatically compresses images

## Landing: Informational

## F-1 Hero-Swoosh

- There are two color options-white and red (as shown)
- The image occupies only the shaded area
- Size images to $1200 \times 675$ pixels at 72ppi


## Landing: Marketing

## F-2 Full Width Hero

- The image is full width and uses most of the height
- There is an overlay tint on the entire image to accommodate the mandatory title and optional description
- Size images to $2100 \times 1400$ pixels at 72ppi

## F-3 Basic Hero

- The image is full width but uses a portion of the height
- After uploading, adjust the focal point in the preview to target the area that works best
- There is a gradient overlay tint from bottom to top to accommodate the

## A-1 Article Heroes

- Size images to $1200 \times 773$ pixels at 72 ppi
- Two hero options

1. Headline on Image: the top and bottom of the image is not visible. There is a gradient overlay tint from bottom to top to accommodate the text.
2. Headline and Image: the full image is displayed with no overlay tint

## C-1 Rich Text

## Inline image

- A minimum image width of 500 pixels and maximum of 2100 pixels can be added to the rich text component. There is no depth restriction.
- There are three image display options. The "Embed" will place the image at half the content width and "Embed-Small" will display it at $1 / 3$ the content width.

## C-10 Person Card

- Size image to $91 \times 121$ pixels at 72 ppi

Tip: Try to keep the size of the person's head consistent with one another for a uniform look


## E-1 Feature Event

- Size images to $720 \times 405$ pixels at 72 ppi

## F-7 Full Width Video

- A poster image (static image) needs to be uploaded and sized to $1600 \times 900$ pixels

Tips:

- The poster image is visible prior to playing the video. If one is not added, then the image will be blank.
- A screenshot of an image will work if a bigger image is not available. See the section on How to Take a YouTube Screenshot.

## F-8 Slideshow

- The image area uses the height and crops off a bit off the sides
- Size images to $1200 \times 675$ pixels at 72 ppi

## F-9 Program Finder

- The image is full width but uses a portion of the height to accommodate copy on the overlay tint
- After uploading, adjust the focal point in the preview to show the area that will work best
- Size images to $1200 \times 600$ pixels at
 72ppi


## F-10 50/50

- A horizontal image is preferred. The entire height of the image is used and will adjust according to how much text there is.
- After uploading, adjust the focal point in the preview to target the area that works best
- If using a vertical image, background must be added to the image. Create a canvas in Photoshop that is $800 \times 800$ pixels at 72 ppi and center the vertical image on a matching background color.
- Size images to $800 \times 800$ pixels at 72 ppi

- A horizontal or vertical image will work for this
- Size images to 800 width $\times 800$ height pixels

- Choose an image that has dead space on the image's left side to allow for the text
- When placed, the component will not show a portion of the top and bottom of the image
- Size images to $1600 \times 900$ pixels at 72 ppi

## F-20 Description \& Image Cards

Two size options

- Size images to $336 \times 336$ pixels at 72 ppi and the system will display it from top to bottom as a square
- The system automatically uses the center of the image unless you upload the images as an exact square

- Size images to $400 \times 533$ pixels at 72 ppi and the system will display it from top to bottom as a square



## F-29 Featured Topic

- The image is full width but uses a portion of the height to accommodate copy placed on the overlay tint
- Size images to $1200 \times 765$ pixels at 72 ppi

Tip: Converting the background image to grayscale helps to highlight the information

## F-30 Descriptive Links

- The image is full width but uses a portion of the height to accommodate copy that appears on the overlay tint
- After uploading, adjust the focal point in the preview to show the area that will work best
- Size images to $2100 \times 418$ pixels at 72 ppi

## FA-2 Feature Article Hero

- There is an overall overlay tint to accommodate the text
- Size hero image to $1200 \times 773$ pixels at 72 ppi



## FA-3 Feature Article-Chapter

## Parallax Scroll Chapters

- The full image width will be used
- The image depth will adjust according to the amount of copy positioned left or right
- Size images to $2100 \times 1400$ pixels at 72 ppi

Tip: Have your subject more to the right or left if you are using this component. This is only available with the Feature Article. The ghosting effect under the text is automatic and is not optional.

## How to Optimize Images

1. Under File>Export>Save for Web

2. When the window opens, adjust the quality to $50-75 \%$ depending on the clarity of the photo. A sharp image will look good at $50 \%$ quality.
3. You can preview the image in the browser before you save the file as a jpg.

## Image Naming Conventions

## Images Downloaded from MerlinOne

Most images downloaded from MerlinOne, the university's digital asset library, will be at least 2880 x 2160 so they can be used anywhere on the site. In some cases, images will be sized for a specific space, and will maintain the current file name and have the appropriate designation appended:

- event_ = used for event
- pub_ = In the News | Publication Icon
- grab_ = screen grab from video
- pro_= profile image
- $\lg$ = Common Images (max size)
- prmo_= Rutgers Today article promotional
- mag_ = Magazine cover thumbnail image
- $\quad$ sm_ = Homepage Mosaic, Stats Image
- $\quad x_{-}=$images should not be reused


## Images from Elsewhere

These images can be any size so it will be important to indicate their size as they are added to the site. Images from elsewhere will use the same size designations as UCM images:

- event_=used for event
- Ig_= Common Images (max size)
- mag_= Magazine cover
- $\quad$ sm_ = Homepage Mosaic, Stats Image
- pro_ = profile image
- prmo_ = Rutgers Today article promotional thumbnail image
- $\quad x_{-}=$images should not be reused
- pub_= In the News | Publication Icon

## How to Take a YouTube Screenshot and Save as a .jpg

1. Download the Google Chrome browser extension "hyde" or something similar. The hyde extension allows you to hide the playback controls on YouTube.
2. Go to your YouTube video.

3. Check the gear icon on the playback bar to ensure the video quality is as high as possible, e.g., 1080p.

4. Navigate to the screenshot you need.

Tip: Use the left and right arrow keys to advance/rewind in 5 second increments; use the comma (,) and period (.) keys to advance/rewind by 1 second.

When you've found the moment in the video you want to screenshot, pause your video and bring your player to full screen mode (note the rightmost, broken square icon in the playback bar below).

5. Activate the hyde extension by pressing Ctrl+M to remove the playback controls.
6. Take a screenshot. (On a PC: Shift+Windows key+S Use the toolbar at the top of the screen to take a full-size screenshot. On a Mac: Command+Shift+3)

7. Open Photoshop or your photo editing app of choice and create a $2100 \times 1400$ pixel canvas, or one sized to meet the needs of your use case.

8. Place your screenshot over the canvas. (On a PC: Window key+V to paste from clipboard; On a Mac: drag the screenshot file from your Finder into your photo editor.)

9. Scale your image to fit. In Photoshop: Edit > Transform > Scale. Adjust your image from the corner so it fits completely into your canvas. Optional - edit your image by adjusting brightness, color saturation, or other quality edits.

10. Export your image as a .jpg. (In Photoshop: File > Export > Export As). Use the quality of your original screenshot to determine the quality to apply to your .jpg. Screenshots are generally lower quality than a true photo, so select Very Good, Great, or Excellent based on your judgement. Remember, higher the quality, the larger the image file size. Large image files take longer to load on webpages than smaller ones.

11. Save the file you just made into the Media Library of your RCCL site. Content > Media > Add Media > Add Image.
